A. Business Manager Report: Jessica reported that end of the year tax forms, and 4<sup>th</sup> quarter reports are complete and submitted online. SDAO travel packets will be available to pick up in the office on February 6<sup>th</sup> for those attending.

B. Ops Manger Report: Joanie reported that there are two trainee's working on station and working to meet training standards based on the daily observation reports from the trainer. One trainee of the

three trainee's we had last month has resigned stating they were not able to keep up with the pace of dispatch. We are in the recruitment and testing phase of the hiring process.

December Call Status: 9448 total calls of which 4553 came in on a 911 line, 1253 were Fire & EMS, 890 were medical specific, 5379 were law enforcement incidents and 1089 were law enforcement initiated.

CAD Project: Collaborating with our partners we are pursuing a unified project for CAD – Mobile – RMS, from Tyler. This leverages our community buying power, maximizes product efficiencies and features, eliminates stop gap interfaces, and builds on our role as the hub of public safety communications.

We met with KFPD, KCSO and KCFD1 and have support to move forward with this collaborative concept. We are also scheduling a second demo to focus on the Tyler products working together, and some we didn't see.
